Sunnybank Park is the green lung of Sunnybank, Froghall, Powis and Old Aberdeen. It comprises several areas under different ownership and management, but a network of paths knits it all together and gives the feel of a single, sizeable park. The core area is leased and managed by the Friends of Sunnybank Park, a community group that formed in 2010 to stop the area being sold to developers.

It's your neighbourhood!

Sunnybank Park is now part of the Keep Scotland Beautiful network of areas, participating in their "It's Your Neighbourhood" programme, a community environmental improvement initiative which we managed in



partnership with the Royal Horticultural Society under the Britain in Bloom campaign. It runs alongside Beautiful Scotland but is non-competitive and is based on the three pillars (or themes) of



community participation, environmental responsibility and gardening achievement. The 2017 theme is "Birds, Bees & Trees" and we thought that Sunnybank Park was a perfect ground for the growth of a wide

variety of trees and plants, representing a wonderful haven for our flying and buzzing friends!

Sunnybank Park welcomes Wallspot!

Wallspot is an international organisation whose objective is to integrate and bring together all those engaged in urban art: artists, photographers, arts managers and promoters, the general public and the local government, thus creating a global urban art community. We were contacted a few months ago, to discuss the opportunity to become the first wall in Scotland and indeed in the whole of the UK! Keep an eye out for the various works which will appear on the big wall beside the old Tennis courts!



Fight Dirty! Keep YOUR park clean!

Litter has always been an issue in the Park. There are limited bins available (we are working on it!) and



not all users make the small extra effort to carry their rubbish to the nearest communal bin outside the Park. The solution to this problem isn't, however, leaving it behind! Our Teams of volunteers and a lot of everyday users of the Park have constantly engaged in more or less improvised litter picking sessions throughout the year. ACC has provided the Committee with a number of litter pickers, gloves, bags and yellow vests. As part of the Keep Scotland Beautiful,

Sunnybank Community Centre steps in!

Friends of Sunnybank Park and Sunnybank Community Centre are working together to improve and develop the former tennis court area. The Community Centre has secured a considerable amount of funding through "Your street Your say" initiative and Aberdeen Harbour Board that have been invested in the purchase of goal posts, one basketball hoop, outdoor gym equipment and benches. Part of the area will be turned into a pedal go-kart/bicycle track that will be also used by the Community Centre as part of their summer and afternoon programs. Amongst the various projects there is a plan for resurfacing the tennis court area but further funds need to be sought. This is the first of hopefully more initiatives to give the local youth and everyone else opportunities to enjoy the park.
